

Participation Level Options

Level 1: Admin Support – Shoreside Only

Ideal for: Volunteers with physical limitations, limited time, or preference for behind-the-scenes roles.

Responsibilities:

- Attend planning and operational meetings
- Serve on committees (e.g., Fundraising, Marketing, Sponsorship, Grant Writing)
- Coordinate or support logistics for events (Golf Tournament, Education Days, etc.)
- Help with administrative tasks:
 - Roster updates
 - Training matrix tracking
 - Meeting documentation
 - Ordering supplies
- Assist with communication and outreach:
 - Email campaigns
 - o Website content updates
 - Newsletter creation
- Serve as support during drills or missions (from shore only)

Commitment Expectation: 1–4 hours per month; seasonal flexibility; year-round support welcomed.

Ideal for: Volunteers interested in both support duties and occasional water-based activity, such as weekly Coast Guard helicopter drills.

Responsibilities:

• All Level 1 Admin duties (optional)

- Participate in Monday CG Helo Support Missions
 - Act as boat crew during helo drills
 - o Help stage the boat and safety gear
 - Communicate with Coast Guard crew and coordinate logistics
- Act as standby boat crew for training events or drills
- Assist with crew training simulations (man-overboard, safety protocols)
- Be available for non-emergency crew rotations

Commitment Expectation: 4–8 hours per month; consistent participation in Monday drills; flexible additional support.

Devel 3: Primary Rescue Operations Crew

Ideal for: Physically capable, highly engaged members focused on **on-water rescue operations**.

Responsibilities:

- Serve as **primary or secondary responder** for all types of rescue missions (day or night)
- Commit to boat and rescue training (certifications, drills, USCG coordination)
- Participate in rotating on-call crew scheduling
- Lead/assist in Coast Guard and community training exercises
- Maintain operational readiness of vessels:
 - Fuel, equipment checks, electronics testing, cleanup
- Report mission data and participate in post-event debriefs
- Assist with onboarding/training of new operational crew

Commitment Expectation: 6–12 hours per quarter on average (varies seasonally); available for callouts during scheduled shifts.

Level 4: Affiliate Member

Ideal for: A Fripp Island resident with a USCG certification or a Fripp Island Resort staff member who may be asked to participate in FISR operations on an emergency basis.

Responsibilities:

- Serve as primary responder for all types of rescue missions (day or night)
- Participate in rotating on-call boat captain scheduling

Commitment Expectation: 3 - 5 hours per quarter on average (varies seasonally); available for call-outs when needed.
